

BAMBERG COUNTY DELINQUENT TAX SALE

TO ALL PERSONS, PURSUANT TO Title 12, Chapter 51, of the Code of Laws for South Carolina, the following properties will be sold at public auction for the purpose of satisfying delinquent taxes. The sale will commence at 10:00 a.m., Monday, November 5th, 2018 at the Bamberg County Courthouse Courtroom, 5929 Main Highway, Bamberg, SC 29003.

The successful bidder shall be required to pay by cash, money order or certified check made payable to Bamberg County Treasurer for the full amount of the bid and settlement must be made on the day of the sale. The bidder will receive certification that will enumerate the property acquired. If the defaulting taxpayer redeems the property which is sold within 12 months of the date of sale, the successful bidder will be refunded the sale bid. If the property is not redeemed by the defaulting taxpayer, a tax deed will be issued to the successful bidder 12 months after the date of the sale. Bamberg County makes no warranty with respect to the property.

TO PREVENT THE PROPERTIES LISTED BELOW FROM BEING SOLD, PAYMENT MUST BE IN THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE BY 5:00 P.M. ON FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 2ND, 2018. WE ARE NOT ACCEPTING PERSONAL CHECKS—CASH, MONEY ORDER AND CERTIFIED BANK CHECK ONLY. NO TAX PAYMENTS WILL BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY OF THE TAX SALE. ALL ADVERTISED PROPERTY MUST BE SOLD.

BSD#1 Board members observe moment of silence for former student athlete

The Bamberg School District One, regular October meeting got off to a solemn start Monday night, with Board members pausing for a moment of silence to remember one of its former student-athletes Harper Bunch, who reportedly died last Friday morning. "I think we get very comfortable in our community thinking that bad things can't happen here, but in fact they can and do sometimes," Bamberg School District One Superintendent Phyllis Schwarting said in asking the Board for the moment of silence.

Superintendent Schwarting noted that Harper Bunch's

grandparents, parents and his two brothers were all graduates of the Bamberg School District One School System. Also, during Monday night's meeting, Board members were informed that the district would have to makeup three (3) school days. The district missed two days (2) because of Hurricane Florence (one of which was ordered by Governor Henry McMaster) and the other day because the district anticipated Hurricane Michael would have a greater impact than it actually did.

"Our calendar states we will make our days up at the end of school. The last day of school was to be June 5. Currently, we will have makeup days on the 6th, 7th,

and 10th of June, assuming no more bad weather, right now that is our plan," Schwarting said. The Superintendent noted last Thursday's school closure was in anticipation of bad weather, that turned out not to be as bad as anticipated, but the strong winds were a major factor in the decision to close the schools.

"You cannot put a school bus on the road with sustained winds of 30-miles per hour or gusts up to 45-miles per hour. So, I think we made the right call even though the afternoon turned out to be a beautiful afternoon." In other business during Monday night's meeting, in the school reports it was reported that Richard Carroll Elementary School's

enrollment is "holding steady" at 730-students. The school's after school program will start on October 25, for 5th and some 6th grade students. RCES students Matthew Herndon and Cole Davis were recognized for achieving a perfect score on the Mathematics portion of S.C. Ready Test.

Bamberg Ehrhardt Middle School reported a current enrollment of 203-students and it was noted that former B-E and Clemson standout and NFL player Ricky Sapp was a guest speaker at the school recently. Bamberg Ehrhardt High School reported a current enrollment of 386- students. MAP testing was recently completed and the PSAT was given to all 10th graders. The BEHS, Future

Farmers of American held a food drive for victims of Hurricane Florence and first quarter report cards will go out on October 29.

Further in the meeting the Board approved several locally approved courses including: Computer classes at the elementary school for grades K-6 and five (5) courses at the high school. The Board gave second reading approval to 10-policies with a number of the policies including the phrase: "Pregnancy, childbirth or any related medical condition." The Board also gave second reading approval to Policy GCC/GCC-Professional Staff Leaves and Absences. Superintendent Schwarting clarified that an employee does not have to wait

until he or she retires to be paid for any days above 90- that he or she accrues, but can redeem those days at the end of the school year. It was noted the Staff Leaves and Absences Policy does not apply to Administrators, School Psychologists, Teachers' Aides or Custodians.

Board members also gave first reading approval to Policies IKF and IKF-R dealing with graduation requirements and Policy JLDBB-R dealing with suicide prevention, intervention and post-vention. In the financial report, Board members expressed their condolences to district finance director Devon Furr, who returned to work following the loss of her father.

Denmark City Council met on Monday, October 15th. At the start of the meeting executive sessions was approved by the council members for a legal matter.

According to the fire report, there were 52 calls since the last meeting. The breakdown was a gas leak, 12 alarms, 4 EMS calls, 2 auto accidents, 4 fires in Denmark, 1 broken pole and 18 trees cut from the last storm.

The Denmark Police Department created 41 new cases such as simple assault, burglary, disorderly conduct, etc.

Denmark Police Department will place a new school resource officer at Denmark-Olar Middle School on October 22nd. The officer is Robert McGinnis.

The public works department repaired 9 water leaks. The department also assisted Palmetto Site Work Service with paving Gum Tree Court and Connelly Street. A list of light poles that need to be wired was faxed to SCE&G for mounting of the city Christmas light. The city works department assisted Lane Construction Company in the paving of Mayfield Street.

In other business, Mayor Gerald Wright is working to relocate the Dogwood Festival rides and activities as the new city hall will be in that location.

As of this week, work on the new city hall has resumed. Field

work was postponed as a result of last week's storm. The expected date of completion is November.

The city will be presenting a Halloween celebration on October 31st from 5:30 - 7:00 pm at the Jim Harrison Park. Children are encouraged to dress in costumes to participate in the planned activities.

There were public comments by a few members of the local community who asked to remain anonymous. The individuals asked the council what could be done to close Club Magnolia as there was a shooting incident that occurred on October 12, 2018. They mentioned how it affects local businesses within the community, parking rights, safety of the community and can affect the reputation of Denmark.

Mayor Wright and council members will look towards a resolution upon this matter

Baseball field for children with special needs one step closer to reality

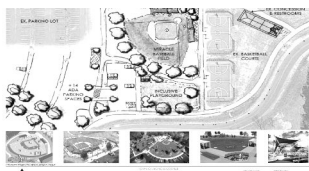
A baseball field for children with special needs is one step closer to becoming a reality in Moncks Corner.

The town council approved an application for a \$25,000 grant that would help pay for the design fees of the field. The town also said it would match the \$25,000 if the grant gets

approved. There would also be an accessible playground right next to the field.

The price tag for the whole project is around \$1.3 million. The town is hoping to raise the rest of the money from fundraisers and corporate partners.

The field itself would have a running track surface that's different than a dirt path typically seen on a baseball field. It would be made from a



special material that would be safe and inclusive. The playground would also be built with the same priorities in mind.

The field would be the first of its kind in Berkeley County.
